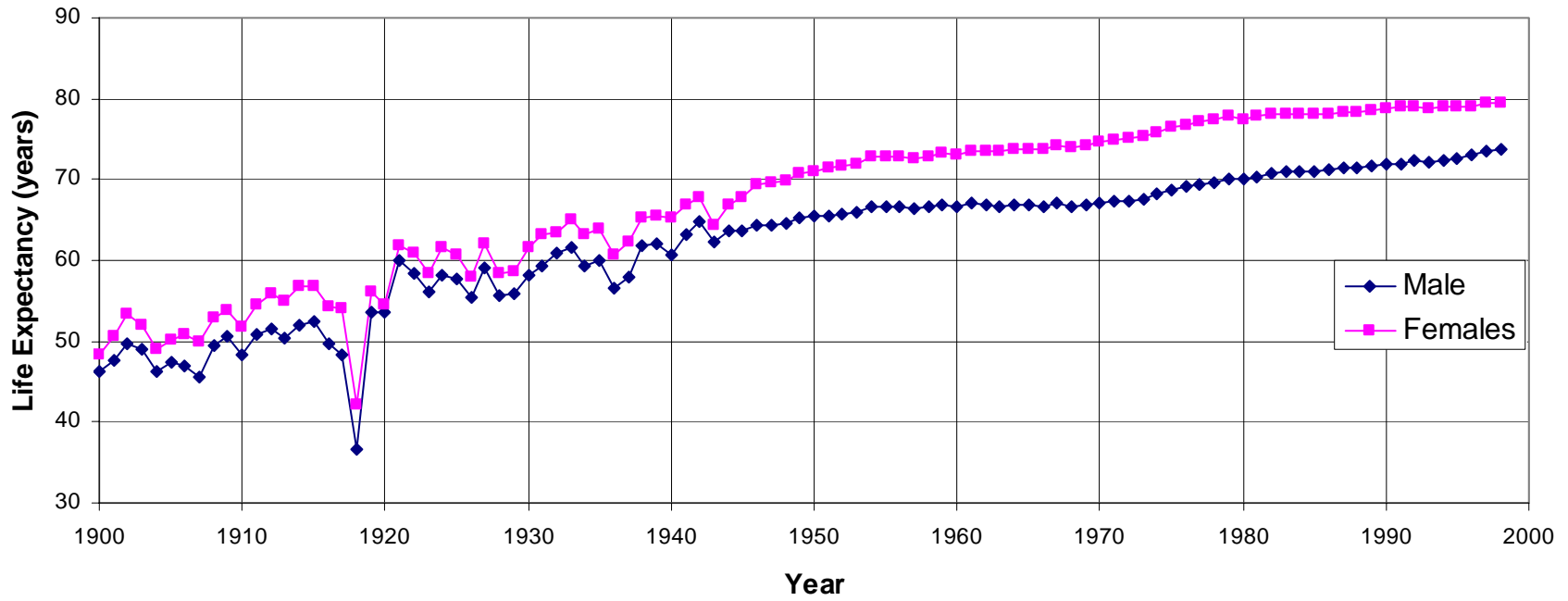


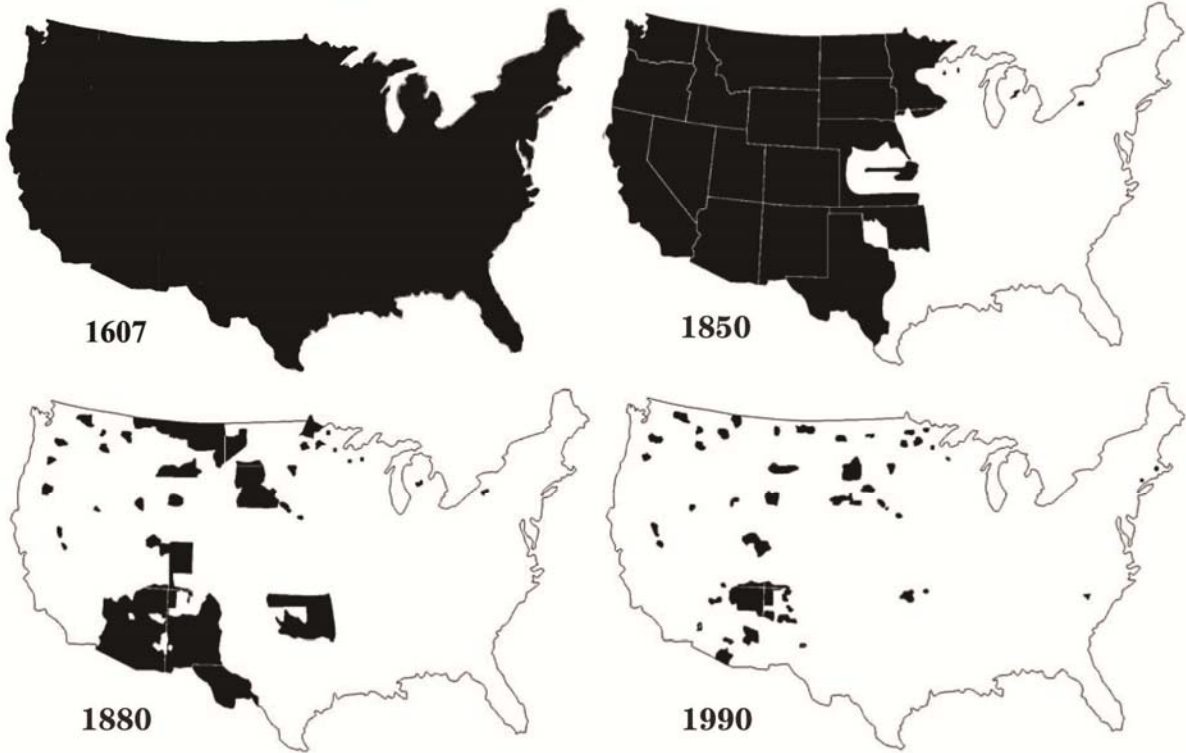
Life Expectancy in the U.S., 1900-1998

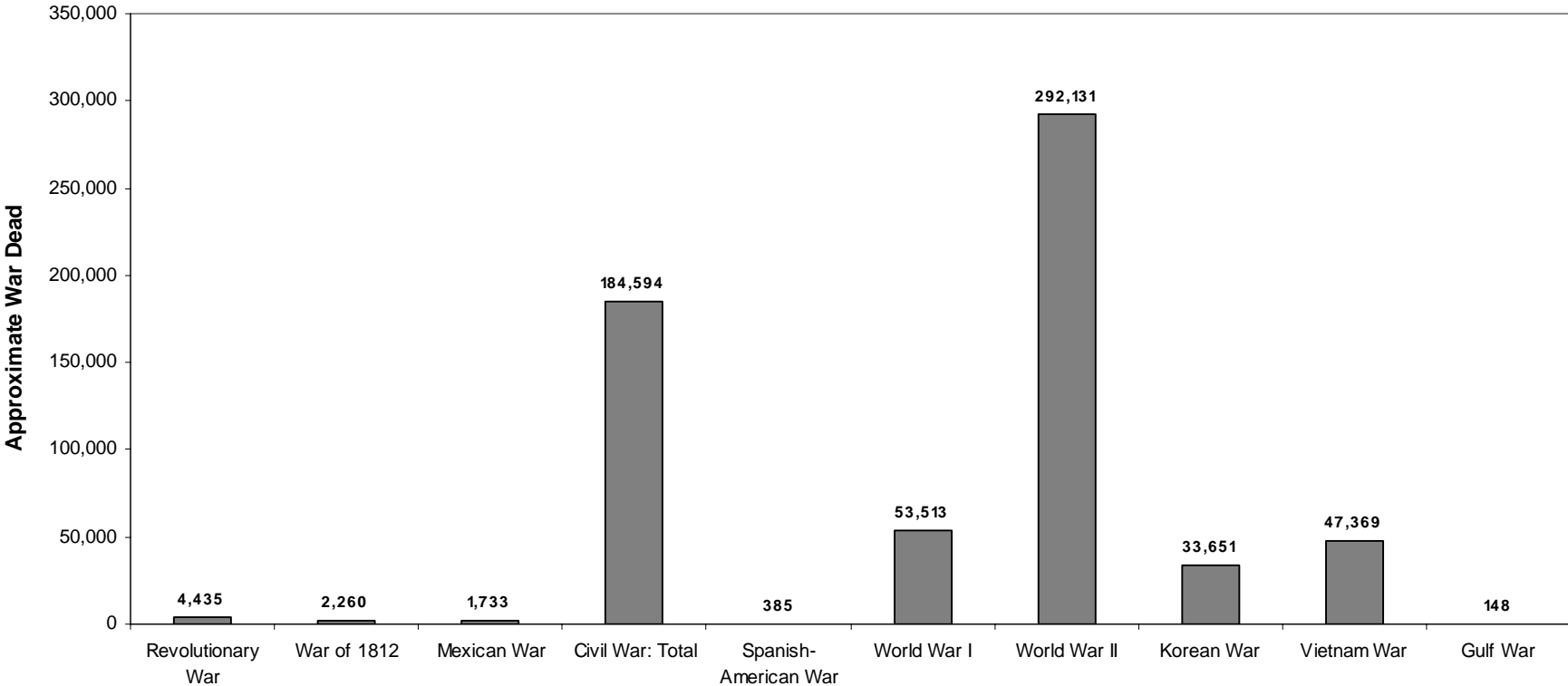

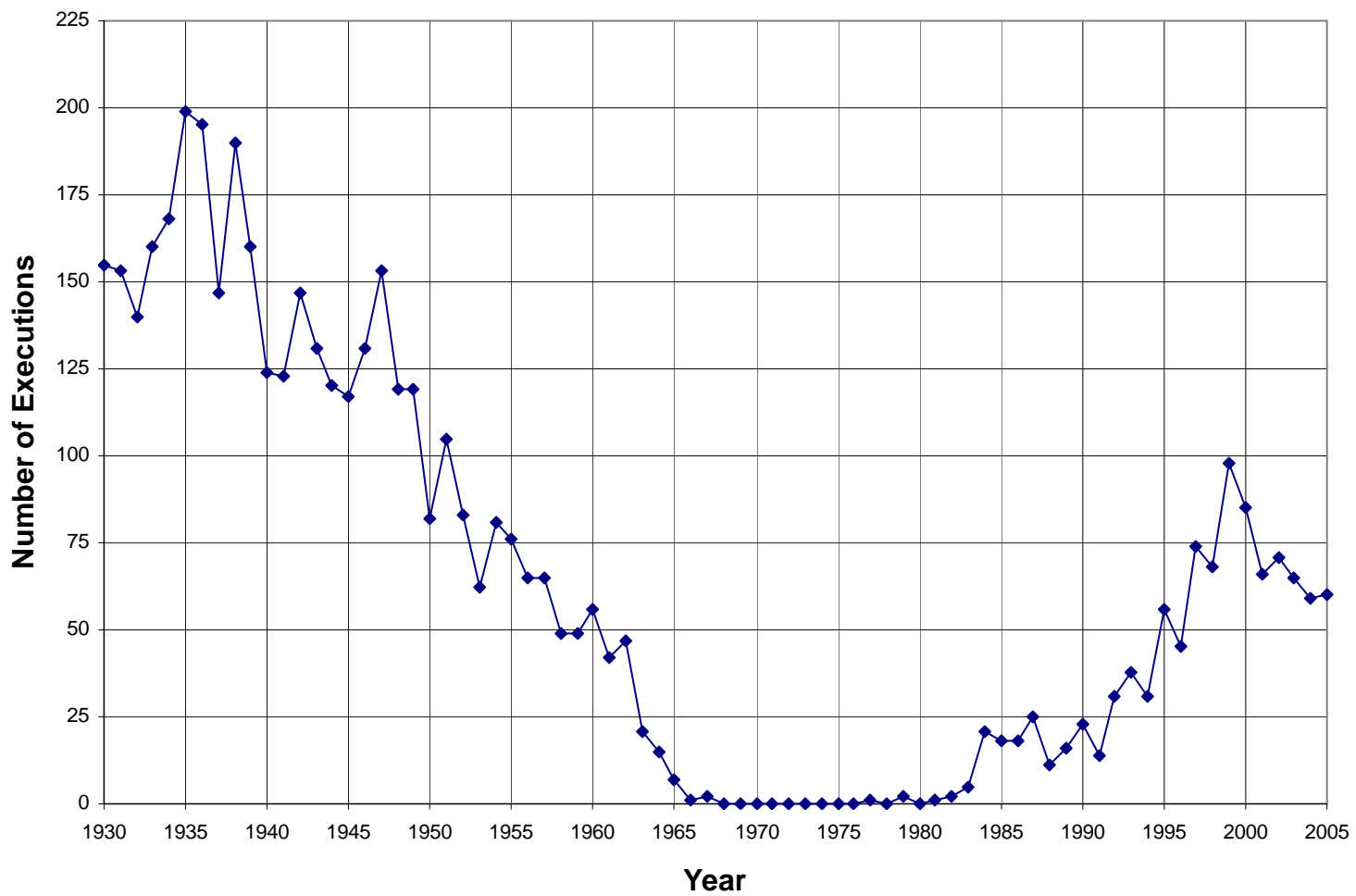

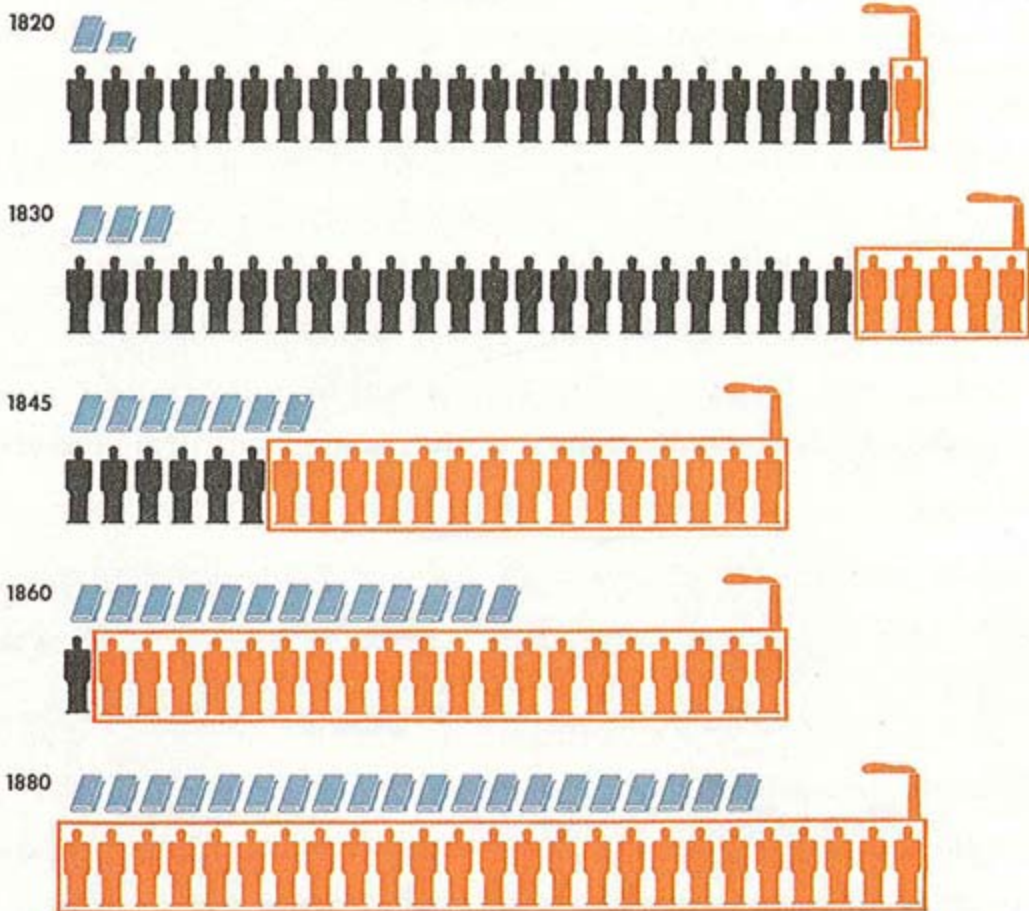

Home and Factory Weaving in England

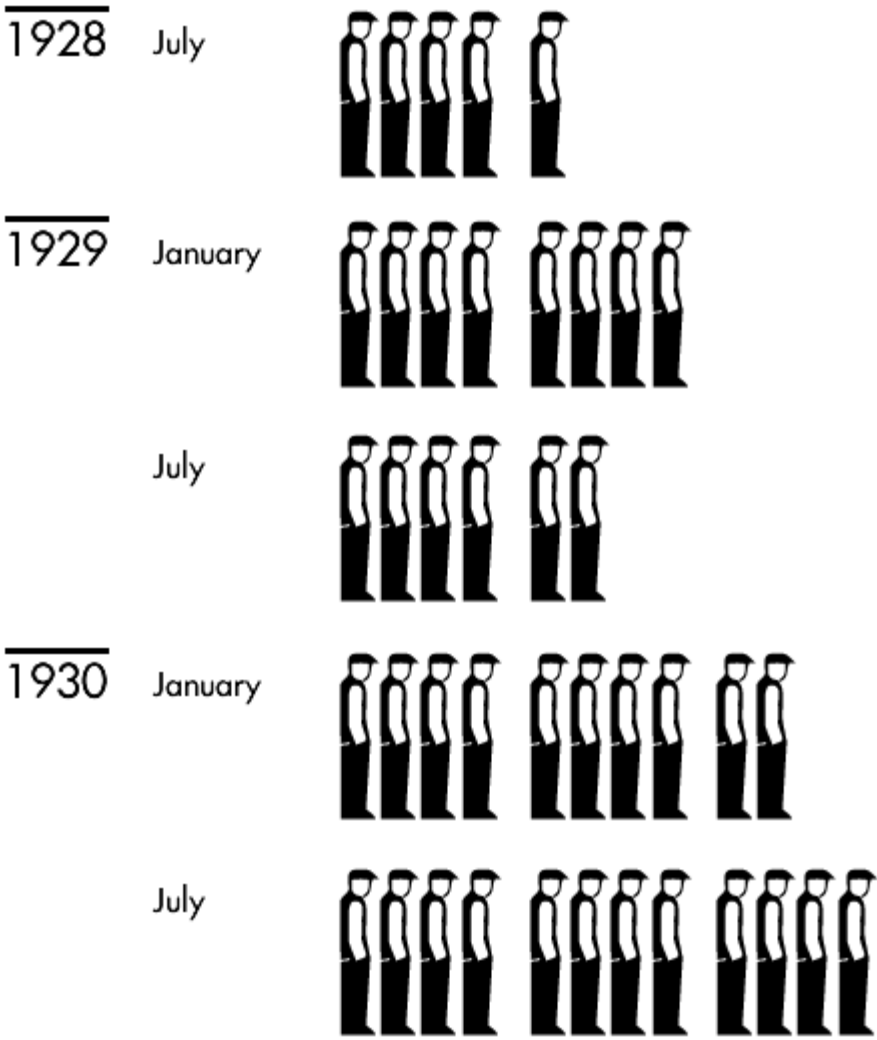


Each blue symbol represents 50 million pounds total production

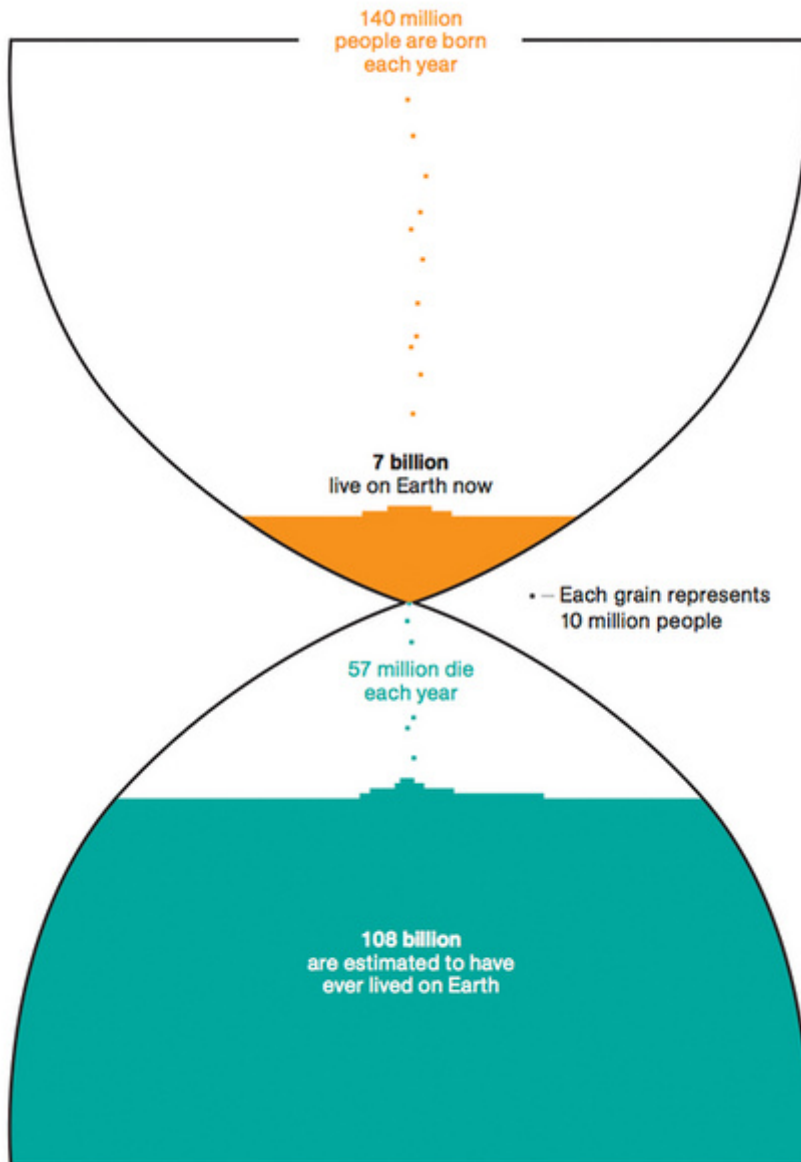

Highest and Lowest Elevations by Continent

The elevation of any place on Earth is measured in terms of how far it is above sea level or below sea level. The following table shows the highest mountain on each continent and the lowest point not covered by water or ice on each continent, not including Antarctica.
